

School Council Constitution

Elections for members will be held once a year, at the beginning of each Autumn Term.

Two representatives will be elected from Year1 to Year 6. Posts are held for one year.

Council meeting will be held once a month.

The Headteacher, teachers, governors, parents and other pupils will sometimes be invited to attend council meetings and will always be kept up to date with council business.
